# Introduction to Malagasy Fauna

#### MAMMALS

Endemics: Lemurs: 5 Families, 100% Endemic: Lemuridea, Hapalemur, Cheirogaleidea, Indridae, Daubentoniidae, 14 Genera, with 51 known species Carnivores: Fossa, civet-like and mongooses, 8 species- 100% endemic Insectivores: Tenrecs, 27 species, 100% endemic

Manambolo River: Red-fronted brown lemurs, Decken's sifaka, and Western gentle lemur (rare).

<u>Tsingy de Bemaraha</u>: Decken's sifaka, red-fronted brown lemur, grey mouse lemur, fat-tailed dwarf lemur and Milne-Edwards sportive lemur.

<u>Kirindy Forest</u>: Verreaux's sifaka and red-fronted brown lemur. Nocturnal: pygmy mouse lemur, grey mouse lemur, red-tailed lemur, pale fork-marked lemur, Coquerel's dwarf lemur and fat-tailed dwarf lemur. Fossa, narrow-striped mongoose, giant jumping rat, common tenrec, greater hedgehog tenrec, and large-eared tenrec.

Ifaty / Toliara: Grey mouse lemur, white-footed sportive lemur and lesser hedgehog tenrec.

Isalo National Park: Ringtailed lemur, Verreaux's sifaka and red-fronted brown lemur.

**Ranomafana National Park:** Golden bamboo lemur, greater bamboo lemur, Eastern grey bamboo lemur, Milne-Edwards' sifaka, red-bellied lemur, red-fronted brown lemur, and brown mouse lemur. Fanaloka (striped civet), eastern ring-tailed mongoose, and red forest rat.

Andasibe National Park: Indri-Indri, diamond sifaka, common brown lemur, red bellied lemur, black-and-white ruffed lemur, grey bamboo lemur. Nocturnal: brown mouse lemur, greater dwarf lemur, eastern woolly lemur, and hairy-eared dwarf lemur. Lowland streaked tenrec, red forest rat and eastern ring-tailed mongoose.

## REPTILES

340 known species, 90% endemicSpecies:Chameleon (66) - Geckos (13) - Snakes (85) - none poisonous<br/>Skinks (50) - Tortoises (4-all endemic) - Frogs (185 - 90% endemic)
